B-LOT PARKING CHANGES

B-Lot parking space designation will change over Winter Break to begin the process of addressing the significant loss of parking spaces when the Chemistry/Physics construction begins in Jan 02. A large section of Pamplin/Derring parking lot will be lost for 2 years to support the project staging area. NEW TRANSIT DIRECTOR ON BOARD

SHULTZ PARKING GATE

The new parking gate in Shultz is currently being installed and is scheduled for activation on January 7, 2002. Faculty and Staff permit holders may gain access with a Hokie Passport or by purchasing a transponder (\$25 for the "hands-free" option) at Parking Services. Visitors can gain access by getting a key code number from Parking Services. Retirees that use Shultz Lot will need to contact Parking Services to be entered into the parking system. Anyone who uses a permit that was purchased under another person's account also needs to contact Parking Services for Hokie Passport activation. You can confirm that the parking gate will open for your Hokie Passport by calling Parking Services at 231-3200.
